


Pfizer Vaccine Approval for: 5-11 YEAR OLDS

The FDA and CDC have approved the use of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for children ages 5-11.

Let's get back to the things we love.



- Children are given two doses of the Pfizer vaccine, 21 days apart.
- Each dose is one-third the amount given to people ages 12 and older.
- Children 5-11 years old should not receive the same dose as those 12 and older.

Surry County Health and Nutrition Center (SCHNC) is now providing COVID-19 vaccinations for children ages 5-11 following the November 2, 2021 approval from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Currently, the Pfizer vaccine is the only option for this newly approved age group, and all children ages 5-11 are eligible under the newest guidance.

Vaccines for children ages 5-11 are smaller doses and are specifically formulated to be safe and effective. Similar to what was seen in adult vaccine trials, vaccination was nearly 91 percent effective in preventing COVID-19 among children aged 5-11 years. In clinical trials, vaccine side effects were mild, with the most common side effects being a sore arm, tiredness, headache, and muscle pain. These side effects are normal signs that their bodies are building protection.

COVID-19 vaccines have undergone, and will continue to undergo, the most intensive safety monitoring. Vaccinating our younger population will help protect them from getting COVID-19 and therefore reduce their risk of severe disease, hospitalizations, and long term COVID-19 complications. Getting your children vaccinated can help protect them against COVID-19 and allow for enhanced in-person learning by helping reduce community transmission.

In addition, getting a COVID-19 vaccine can help protect your child, your family, and others. Vaccinating children can help protect family members, including siblings who are not eligible for vaccination, and those family members who may be at increased risk of getting very sick if they are infected. Children 5 years of age and older becoming fully vaccinated against COVID-19 can also help them safely participate in sports, playdates, and other group activities.

Vaccinations are the number one tool to prevent hospitalization and death from COVID-19.




Christmas Flowers

I AM THE TRUTH.

The arts affirms solid theology and faith. This sketch is by Rev. Paul Grout, Church of the Brethren pastor and artist. Thirty years ago, Paul visited our retreat house in Cape May. Our chapel Stations of the Cross depicting Christ's Passion fascinated him. Once home, he created his own Stations of the Cross. Above is his 1st Station.

Paul's sketch juxtaposes Jesus, The King with Pilate and Jesus, the Servant-leader with Peter.

Both illustrate the Truth about Jesus.

In the highly dramatic confrontation between Pilate and Jesus, the dialogue is everything. Pontius Pilate, a low level lackey of Emperor Tiberius who assigned him to the insignificant Judean territory. He's characterized as weak-willed and coerced into crucifying Jesus; and/or an evil person who demanded the crucifixion.

Clearly, Pilate cannot comprehend a kingdom that is not part of our material world. Pilate, from the heart of his doubt and confusion, defies Jesus' irrationality. Jesus stands toe-to-toe before his accuser, and doesn't flinch even though he's on the threshold of a deadly end. Jesus, who is The Truth, testifies to The Truth. He is who he says he is and knows why he "came into this world."

From Pilate's understanding, this sounds utterly ridiculous and, even *a lie*, a *big lie*. The Truth claims his truth, then draws the proverbial line in the spiritual sand,

"Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

Pilate responds by washing his hands of his relationship with Jesus and The Truth. Compare The King's encounter with Pilate and The King's encounter with Peter. The Bowl is centered in the sketch to highlight its purpose in both encounters.

First, The Bowl is used to show the denial of Truth and Presence. This Bowl is the essence of washing your hands of the situation...disengaging...shrouding your cowardice in blustering bravado and pseudo security... *I'm not in this...*the presence of the bowl symbolizes Pilate's denying Jesus justice, and denying the Presence of Truth. I choose to wash my hands of this, him, and cave to the crowd. *Crucify him yourselves!*

When I'm deep inside of me
Don't be too concerned
I won't ask for nothin' while I'm gone
But when I want sincerity
Tell me where else can I turn
'Cause you're the one I depend upon
Honesty is such a lonely word
Everyone is so untrue
Honesty is hardly ever heard
And mostly what I need from you

The Bowl on the bottom sketches the Truth of who The King really is as Servant-leader. Authority is given for service, for washing feet. This is the Truth.

By the fragile bridge of the Servant's bow We take up the basin and the towel ~ Michael Card
