Feast of Body and Blood of Christ June 23, 2019 Believe what you read. Teach what you believe. Practice what you teach. Become who you receive.

Why not give them something to eat yourselves? is a troubling question while a hungry crowd of over 5,000 waits. This question is wrought with impracticality. Why would Jesus ask it so far from the nearest town center?

Jesus *always* asks the questions no one else thinks of or is willing to ask. His questions are meant to draw you in and then to provoke you into responding as he would.

Christ's question demands your creative ability to move outside the status quo box. "Feeding the crowd" is a daunting task. So be practical and respond with *what you can do*, not what you can't. Start with the relationships, the "crowd" of your family, neighbors, and any pilgrims you meet on your way Home.

Nourish them with compassion and your willingness to listen to their story. Offer your encouragement, and your healing presence. Jesus brings these specific "crowds" to you intentionally. So, feed Jesus' sheep in your own faith-filled, personal way.

Pray daily to know specific ways to "feed" his crowds.
