The first Rite and first anointing of our faithjourney is at our Baptism.

Prior to Vatican Council II, Catholics knew Extreme Unction as "Last Rites" which means the last anointing.

Before VC II, usually only those who were actively dying were anointed.

Sixty years ago, VC II revised all the Sacraments' Rites. Extreme Unction, now called Anointing of the Sick, can be celebrated with those who are actively dying, suffering from chronic physical, psychological or emotional illness, or preparing for surgery.

We use hand sanitizer before coming forth to receive Communion to insure the highest level of protection for everyone.



## Morning, Church!

In the broader understanding of relationship, all of us, whether you're still pursuing academics or adulthood, have been married, separated or divorced too many time to count. You may initially balk at this observation, so let's break it open in light God's Great Command and the Catholic marriage vows mashup seen above this reflection.

A promise is a promise. Keeping promises is the bond of trust in relationships. In being true to someone else, you are being true to yourself. You'll have days that are better and worse; days that are insideout from the time your alarm sounds. Sometimes you generates the better and sometimes you generate the worse in your relationships, in your family, job, school or in the wider circle of God's Neighborhood and Creation.

The richness of who you are as a Child of God is quickly impoverished by your selfishness, sense of entitlement, your need to control others, or condemn them. Poverty of spirit is more debilitating that fiscal poverty. It reveals your needy spirit that begs for wholeness and peace. Unlike worldly, material poverty, spiritual poverty has long-term implications.

Sickness and health could be about your physical status. On a broader spectrum it's about your attitude. Some days you awake "off", grumpy, edgy, ill at ease with *yourself*. Your dis-ease with yourself creates space between you and others. As my wise sister, Ellyn, once said,

"Don't make other people pay because you're having a bad day."

It takes tremendous inner strength and courage to remain living in Love with those who love us and those who don't. It take compassion to own your brokenness as you compassionately companion The Broken around you ~ especially in your closest relationships.

This is why loving and honoring others is key to living the Great Command. When The Broken are vulnerable enough to share his/her brokenness or needs, it is a grace and a model for you to do the same. It is an invitation to hold and uphold them in the "infirmity" of their suffering  $\sim$  just as Jesus holds and upholds you in your brokenness.

Honoring others in your relationships is the deepest level of keeping your promise to be true to God, yourself and others. It means ignoring your juvenile impulse to separate from or divorce others because of differing views. It means you don't end relationships because relationships require so much energy, thoughtfulness, forgiveness; many more than second chances. Loving and honoring means you own your graced mess and you are ever aware that, in God's Neighborhood, everyone is just as graced and messy as you are.

Loving and honoring is not the sole/soul vocation of the married. All God's children are called to do likewise. Love requires sacrifice, collaboration, communication, sensitivity, letting go of your desire to be right, listening to others with an open heart ~ in the good, bad, better, worse, richness, poverty, sickness and health of your shared, sacred faithjourneys.
