For Sacrament preparation, you must be a registered, active member and attend preparation sessions.



Do not conform yourselves to this age...
...be transformed by the renewal of your minds...
...discern what is the will of God,
what is good and pleasing and perfect.

Morning, Church!

Temptations abound. Some are blatant confrontations why others are insidiously covert urgings. Temptations abound, they confront, and they dare you to give into what is merely temporary, what will give you a brief respite or sense of comfort in this time that challenges your deepest beliefs.

It may strike you, as it does me, the timelessness of God's Word in today's liturgy. God's Word has power, power to transform your heart and mind, your life and your choices. The temptation that stands between you and God's Word and Truth is to conform to this age and its vitriolic voices and violence; to condone by your silence, all that is division and destructive in our country now. The temptation is ongoing as it seeps into the heart almost undetected. Once it takes us residence, it effects and infects every thought, word and action.

Jeremiah, a most reluctant prophet, tried everything he could to urge the Israelites not to conform to the pagan lifestyle of their adductors, the Babylonians and their idolatrous ways. For his efforts, he was arrested, imprisoned, and publicly disgraced. He paid for his nation's impenitence and the sealing of its doom. King Nebuchadnezzar would capture and destroy Jerusalem, and take its leading citizens into exile. Jeremiah remained among the ruins of Jerusalem until he, too, got forced into Egyptian exile.

Like Jeremiah, Paul urged the First Followers not to be conformed to their age and culture. Wonder what they'd say about the pandemic's 200K preventable death...about our public health being politicized... ...about our systemic racism and white nationalism...about our environment that cries out for restoration and healing...this is our world that we're tempted to air bush instead of address with love and understanding.

Conforming to this age fortifies the "isms." Conforming to this age is counter to The Way of the gospel. To resist conforming to this age means taking up our cross, praying honestly to see our true self with all our gifts, leanings, biases (hidden and obvious), and all those assumptions we have about the prophets in our midst.

Openness to God's specific graces at this time is critical for "the transformation of your mind." Unless you live a counter-culture lifestyle, you will easily be drown in the vortex of silence and complacency. Like the Israelites who were abducted and enslaved by the Egyptians, you will be abducted and enslaved by the culture and its violence-based values.

Jesus commands his followers to banish the evil values of the culture and take up his cross. Only if you are willing to lose our life for the sake of the gospel will be gain eternal life. Conformity to culture condemn its followers. Be God's prophet: speak up for what is good, right, and just. Resist compromising your integrity.

This struggle is a daily struggle. Like Jeremiah, Paul, and Jesus, you'll get a lot of push back when you stand in your faith. You'll make mistakes and you may even suffer for the gospel. You're in good company. The One who calls you to be prophet will sustain you to the end.

Do not conform yourself to this age, but be transformed by the renewal of your minds that you might know what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.
