Twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time September 1, 2019

Our society seems to be most comfortable with a hierarchy, a pecking order or social caste system. Weddings and large dinners, have a strict seating charts. You take your name card and sit at a designated table, whether you know your tablemates or not. In my first years of community life, the sisters always sat at the long dining room table in the same order: the professed sisters sat at the top of the table, and the novices at the bottom.

Today's Word challenges any discrimination or pride. The virtue of Humility does not discriminate. It's a wondrous teacher, a Divine Plane that keeps one's self image level. Humility, the opposite of pride, is also its healer. A humble heart does not rank others. A prideful heart drives a craving for attention, and seeking others' affirmation or gratitude. Constant attention-seeking can turn one into a social stigma because the vice of Pride is a real soul sapper.

The virtue of Humility is the core in the Word. Sirach says the humble find favor with God. Jesus' parable teaches us to live, sans a sense of entitlement. The parable teaches the importance knowing your place at an event. It is important for the host to invite those who can't repay you. These gospel examples are pure counter-culture.

Humility graces us to set ego aside and serve others without distinction.

Wherever we are, we are called to give service.

Wherever we are, we're are called to be welcoming and inclusive presence.

It is Christ who calls others to join us so we can nourish them in loving presence. It is Christ who invites us to this feast.

The heart of Christ has no seating chart. Neither ought we, who strive to live his gospel.
