Shepherding the Shepherds

Morning Church!

None of us have God's breath of patience. Even God's patience runs paper thin when God's people are being scattered, not cared for or driven away by those entrusted and appointed to gather, nurture, and protect them. Jeremiah calls out the kings of Judah who have gravely failed in their leadership. Their failures lead to the destruction of Jerusalem and The Exile. They, along with the false prophets they support, mislead the very people they were called to serve and shepherd in God's Name. God amends this injustice and restores the community with new leaders who will guide the Remnant of Believers back home. God has no patience for injustice.

At this point in his ministry, Jesus is gaining popularity and is easily recognized. People "hastened" to be with him as he moved from place to place. Jesus, "moved with compassion for them" saw them as "sheep without a shepherd." He understood their desire to be with him and the desperate look in their eyes. Jesus knew the desire of their hearts: they wanted the "...green pastures, the restful waters, and the abundant table" promised by God.

They wanted to be with Jesus, the one who lead by example and lived what he preached. He modeled leadership in his ministry of presence, his teachings, healings, selflessness, and willingness to help and connect with all who came to him in faith. Jesus' leadership engaged, motivate, encouraged, united and inspired them \sim and us \sim to walk The Word and follow The Way.

Leaders in Jeremiah and Jesus' time, and those entrusted with leadership in our Church today, are called to serve as a link to the Divine, as one who reconnects and reconciles the divisiveness groups and attitudes that try hard to tear us and our souls apart. Good leaders initiate collaboration to act as a catalyst for consensus. True leaders/shepherds give equal access to the conversations that continue to shape us as a faith community. This is call "Sensus Fidei."

"The Second Vatican Council strongly emphasized the importance of the sense of the faithful, affirming that all the baptized participate in their own proper way in the three offices of Christ -- as prophet, priest and king...The council clearly taught that the laity are not merely passive recipients of what the hierarchy teaches and theologians explain; rather, they are living and active subjects within the Church. All believers play a vital role in the articulation and development of the faith." ~ Msgr. Thomas P. Ivory

Baptized and anointed in Christ, *all of us* are called to be compassionate shepherds, to lead by example and to be impatient with injustice.
