Morning Church!

All of us have scheduled events and routines for the days, the week and months ahead on a calendar or phone. For the most part, our plans will take place without the pattern of interruptions of stricter COVID days.

Is it your experience that, whenever an appointment or a meeting, a gathering, a Zoom session, or phone call is scheduled, there is a snag, an unforeseen situation that alters what you have scheduled?

Resurrection is God's Divine Interruption. Resurrection is God's intentional disruption in human history. Jesus, the Christ became human, lived, died and rose from the dead to disrupt our way of thinking "...he opened their minds..."

How does this Divine Interruption, Christ's Resurrection, change or influence you and your choices in any way, and awaken you from any numbness, complacency or a spirit mired in apathy in the last year.

The Risen Christ's Presence can heal your numbness, complacency, and your apathetic spirit.

Christ's post-Resurrection visits disrupted the disciples' fear and anxiety and graced them with courage and calm.

Jesus' first words to the barricaded believers is, "Shalom...Peace be with you." There is no resentment in his voice, only understanding and acceptance. Christ's *Shalom* is profusely poured over them. He has come to be their Peace and Presence, their Compassion and Comfort, their Healing and Hope.

Take notice: Jesus doesn't hide his Wounds. He wants them, and us, to know he truly experienced suffering in his body and overcame the excruciating pain and the death that these Wounds inflicted on him.

Seeing Jesus and receiving his peace and forgiveness is not enough. His followers must become witnesses to all they have heard and seen. They must proclaim his Good News to everyone, in every land, to the ends of the Earth.

We, too, are called in Baptism, to give witness to Christ's Life, Death, and Resurrection. Giving witness to this call means our lives are "interrupted" on a daily basis. Giving witness to your faith, like love and justice, can happen only where your feet are.

Witnesses must do more than bystanders. (FYI: witness in Greek means martyr)
May this Easter Season be for you a sustaining grace.
