The power struggles throughout in God's Neighborhood have intensified every hour. As this Sacred Year of Grace comes to an end, we continue to witness the power melees and blatant resistance to our Democracy's normal transfer of power to the new administration. In every government, even the most corrupt, there is a natural or violent segue to the incoming leader.

Authority and power are given for service. Positive use of power helps to make things happen, like starting your car on a cold Sunday morning. (Yeah!) On the other hand, power can corrupt, oppress, and ignite negativity ~ all of which breed anger and riotous reactions.

Today's Feast of Christ the King celebrates Jesus, who proclaimed, "My kingdom is not of this world"
