God is not fair. God is Love.

Morning, Church!

It's just not fair. It's not fair to be confined or limited in our movements for over six months. It's not fair to be living in this multi-layered pandemics: job anxieties /unemployment; concerns about financial obligations; family members becoming students at home; food insecurities; rampant verbal and physical expressions on an explosive new level of violence in our streets; our raw, systematic racism surfacing in our hearts, attitudes, and country. It's not fair, it's just not fair that lives are turned upside down, inside out, and backwards in a year that began with so much promise. The Year of Grace, 2020, touted as the decade of new, clearer vision, seems so broken.

Jean-Pierre Médaille, S.J., helped form the first Sisters of St. Joseph community. He tried to set people on fire with God's love. Wherever he preached, he established Christian communities and missioned them to spread their love of God among their neighbors. He gave them *Maxims of Perfection* to keep them focused on the mission. Most Sundays, one of these Maxims is in our bulletin. Medaille hoped the Maxims would help people lead lives that would glorify God in any and all situations ~ the fair and the unfair.

One of Maxim inspires others to *concentrate on the good works themselves*, not the reward. Médaille's emphasized the value of paying attention to the mission and not *what others are doing or not doing*. He invited them to promote God's glory, *doing good for its own sake*, so they would become more like the God, who does everything for love and only for love.

God is not fair. God is Love. God invites us to bask in divine goodness, to stay focused on Christ's mission and to pay attention to what *God says is fair and unfair*. No matter what hour you began laboring in the field of faith, working hard to realize the completion of Christ's mission, don't be held hostage by pervasive unfairness, especially today. Instead, counter unfairness with God's abundant love and "...conduct yourself in a way worthy of the gospel..."
